Not in My City, Not in My State Proclamation January 11th National Human Trafficking Awareness Day

WHEREAS, The issue of human trafficking is the fastest growing crime both globally and nationally. It is a crime against humanity- against human dignity and basic civil rights. Every person has value and rights that our society and laws must uphold and protect. And,

WHEREAS, each and every citizen has a right to feel safe in the community that they live. And,

WHEREAS, Human trafficking- whether labor trafficking or sex trafficking- is modern day slavery, it is not only happening overseas, but in our own backyards. It is happening in the United States, California, and even in our city of Sacramento. It is happening to men, to women and to our children. And,

WHEREAS, The issue of human trafficking is the most unifying social justice issue of our day, **The Not in My City, Not in My StateCampaign** is strategic in *taking back* the reputation of our city to show the community that the city of Sacramento is making a stand against all forms of human trafficking and pledging to effectively work together to end this crime of human trafficking that targets our most vulnerable populations.

THEREFORE, the city of Sacramento resolves to remain informed about the problem in its local context, work to protect victims of human trafficking with effective services and support, prosecute traffickers through consistent enforcement to the full extent of the law, prevent human rights abuses by furthering public awareness and confronting the causes and modern slavery.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Council for the city of Sacramento proclaims that "we will not tolerate anyone in our city being exploited and/or sold in any manner -under our watch". We will declare "Not in my City" and publicly recognize January 11th as

National Human Trafficking Awareness Day at a local level, on this day, in this year and each year thereafter.
