Religious leaders are often turned to by Victims of domestic violence as the first resource for understanding and help. This is both good and bad news. On the one hand it is good in the sense that victims intuitively feel they will be well received believed and understood in turning to their clergy. On the other hand it is bad because most

clergy are inadequately trained and qualified to respond in a helpful manner. In fact they often unintentionally do more harm than good. But that does not have to be the case. Training is available.
