Guidelines for Articles for the ICGS Newsletter

Timing: items for the next weekly ICGS Newsletter should be sent via email to newsletter@sacramentointerfaith.org no later than the Sunday before publication. We usually send the newsletter out on Wednesdays. We suggest that you submit your item 2 weeks before your event so that we have time to approve it and include it in the newsletter. We normally include your event in the newsletter until the event is over.

Format: if you have a flyer that is available online, you can send us the link to the flyer. Otherwise, please send a pdf flyer that is 500 KB or less in size. We prefer that you send us the title and text that you would like us to include with the flyer. Please see previous newsletters for the standard article format and limit

your text to 2-3 short paragraphs, including the event date, time and location. We will convert the pdf flyer to a jpg flyer for display in the newsletter. If you don't send text, be sure that the pdf file contains text that can be copied and pasted into the newsletter. If you send a jpg flyer instead of a pdf flyer, we cannot copy text from a jpg file, so we will just show the flyer in the newsletter with a brief title.
